What is the LCMC?

The LCMC, or Lutheran Churches in Mission for Christ, is a congregational-ly based association of Lutheran congregations. While other Lutheran denominations categorize themselves as “progressive” or “conservative”, LCMC congregations are “free in Christ” (Galatians 5:1) to be who God calls us to be.

While LCMC congregations are free to be creative in how we do ministry, working together to transform the lives of others and fulfilling the Great Commission that Jesus set forth in Matthew 28, we are still accountable to God and His mission - as well as to each other.

What kind of Worship Service does Holy Cross Lutheran Church (HCLC) have?

Currently, HCLC alternates between two worship services: Service of the Word (*ELW – pg. 210) and Holy Communion Setting 1. (*ELW – pg. 94). If you enjoy traditional Lutheran worship, you will be comfortable at Holy Cross.

What can I expect if I visit Holy Cross Lutheran Church?

Expect to be welcomed to HCLC as you are part of God’s family. Spend time in the presence of God through Word and Sacrament. Expect to leave a HCLC worship service empowered by the Holy Spirit and refreshed with the promises of the Gospel.

HCLC worship services generally last approximately 1 hour. After worship, you are invited into the fellowship hall for refreshments and fellowship time. You are welcome at HCLC. People at HCLC don’t have any expectations about what you wear, who you are, or your social status. All of us are God’s children. All have sinned, fall short of the glory of God, and need His forgiveness. (Romans 3:23, 1 John 1:8-9)
